

IDAHO LAW DAY PODCAST CONTEST GUIDELINES & RUBRIC

Please note: any submission that does not meet all the outlined criteria will be disqualified.

- Participating students are in grades 9 to 12.
- Students can develop podcasts as a school-sponsored project or may work independently.
- Podcasts are created individually or in groups of 2 or 3 students.
- Submissions are between 5 and 10 minutes long.
- Entries address all the elements of the podcast prompt and adhere to Law Day Podcast Rubric criteria.
- Podcast are submitted using the online form on our website which requires entrants to certify that podcasts are original work, follow the Fair Use Doctrine, and list sources used in the podcast (show notes).

Delivery	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Well-rehearsed, smooth, and conversational delivery • Vocabulary and grammar enhance content and includes language appropriate for all audiences • (For podcasts with two or three team members) Divides the speaking parts evenly among the team members 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mostly rehearsed, smooth, and conversational delivery • Vocabulary and grammar mostly enhance content and include language appropriate for all audiences • (For podcasts with two or three team members) Mostly divides the speaking parts among the team members 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Some rehearsal and some uneven delivery • Vocabulary and grammar somewhat enhance the content or includes some language not appropriate for all audiences • (For podcasts with two or three team members) Somewhat divides the speaking parts evenly among the team members 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minimal rehearsal and uneven delivery • Vocabulary and grammar are basic or may include instances of language not appropriate for some audiences • (For podcasts with two or three team members) Some team members have minimal speaking parts 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivery is hesitant and choppy; sounds like the presenter is reading • Vocabulary and grammar are inappropriate for the audience • (For podcasts with two or three team members) Some team members have no speaking parts
Production	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recorded in a quiet environment without background noise • Volume of voice, music, and effects enhance the presentation • Transitions are smooth and spaced with no dead air space • Fully Integrates sound effects and/or music that enhances the production value of the podcast 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recorded in a mostly quiet environment with minimal background noise • Volume of voice, music, and effects mostly enhance the presentation • Transitions are mostly smooth and spaced with little dead air space • Sound effects and/or music are mostly integrated in a way that adds value to the podcast 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recorded in a somewhat quiet environment with some distracting background noise • Volume of voice, music, and effects is mostly consistent • Transitions are somewhat smooth and spaced with some dead air space • Adds some music and/or sound effects that add interest to the podcast 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recorded in a semi-noisy environment with distracting background noise • Volume of voice, music, and effects is occasionally distracting • Transitions are uneven with inconsistent spacing or dead air space • Music and/or sound effects are clunky or do not enhance the production value of the podcast 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recorded in a noisy environment with constant background noise • Volume of voice, music, and effects are highly distracting • Transitions are abrupt and dead air space needs to be filtered • Does not include any music and/or sound effects
